- The UFT board convenes every June and November
 - HQ AFRC/A3 sends advance board notification to throughout the command
 - While existing Reserve members process packages through the MPS, non-prior service (NPS) applicants process applications through their local Reserve recruiter to HQ AFRC/A3
 - Any waivers or exceptions to policy included in the application are routed through Reserve command channels to HQ AFRC/A1KP who will staff to the next approval level
- Reserve flying units may sponsor as many applicants as there are requirement to fill



UFT

- UFT graduates can be carried as overages according to AFI 36-2115, Assignments Within the Reserve Components, for 6 years from the total federal commissioned service (TFCS) date
- UFT graduates will incur a Reserve service commitment according to IAW AFRCI 36-2102, *Air Force Reserve Service Commitment Date Program,* for 10 years from course completion
- Inter-service transfers applying for rated billets must meet criteria for aeronautical rating (ARB/FEB) and projected against valid vacant positions

Deserving Airman Commissioning Program

- Wing/RMG commanders may choose to fill existing officer authorized vacancies via the Deserving Airman Commissioning Program
 - Line officer commissions only
 - Normally, personnel are not recommended for officer vacancies within the unit currently assigned
- Deserving Airman Commissioning Program selection boards and procedures are established locally with the intent to nominate the best candidate for commissioning, while recognizing all interested and qualified individuals
 - Establishes a resource pool of qualified candidates

Deserving Airman Commissioning Program

- Applicants must meet all requirements according to AFI 36-2005, Appointment in Commissioned Grades and Designation and Assignment in Professional categories—Reserve of the Air Force and United States Air Force, to include:
 - Be of high moral character and personal qualifications
 - Be a United States (US) citizen
 - Be medically qualified, or medically acceptable with a waiver (AFI 48-123, *Medical Examination and Standards*)
 - Be less than 35 years old by the date of appointment
 - Have a baccalaureate or higher degree or scheduled to graduate before the end of the fiscal year in which the selection board meets

Deserving Airman Commissioning Program

- Packages selected for commissioning are forwarded from the MPS to the NAF/RMG commander, as appropriate, for approval
- Approved candidates are forwarded from the NAF/RMG to ARPC Appointments Branch for a final screening and to begin the scrolling process
- Through coordination with ARPC, HQ AFRC/A1KP schedules OTS class dates
 - Once scheduled, training RIPs are produced at the member's servicing location
- Servicing organizations assist students in preparation for class and off they go!
