This award covers accomplishments from Oct. 2008 through Sept. 2009, which was the first full year since the 477th Fighter Group and AMDF stood up. "Receiving the award affirmed all the hard work by so many who are often doing jobs outside their AFSCs because those positions had not yet been given to us," said Baker. He explained that nurses, medical technicians and records custodians all worked outside their specialties. All unit members came together and worked hard to build the flight from the ground up and accomplish the mission, said Baker.

Approximately 15 months after standing up one of the unit's squadrons mobilized. It was one of the biggest challenges that the AMDF had to overcome, said Baker. They stood up a Self Aid and Buddy Care and a Basic Life Support program so that all 130 deployers could receive the required training in-house. They also



cleared them all medically to meet mobility requirements. They had unique challenges, said Baker, since they were the first-ever total force integrated medical flight to support

the F-22. "There is an amazing work ethic with a willingness to move forward even when the path ahead is not well trod," said Baker of his Airmen.

Baker attributes this award to his Airmen's hard work and the 477th AMDF is proud to boast the Outstanding Aerospace Medicine Non-Commissioned Officer of the Year for 2009, Staff Sgt. Sammy Jeffery. She is a trained flight medicine technician and helped with mobilization, flight records, physical standards, medical records reviews and standing up the flight.

"She had to do all the medical records reviews for the deployment," said Baker. She was a positive person and hard-worker; she influenced morale

Please note the introduction of our new aimpoint—to "formalize unit compliance programs". We will provide added emphasis to continue building unit processes and procedures in accordance with the approved management internal controls provided by our Group Inspection experts. We are only seventeen UTA weekends away from our unit's first Unit Compliance Inspection, so make the time count.

As many of you are aware, approximately thirty of our F-22 Ops and MX personnel are literally in the process of loading A3 bags on pallets for another PACOM Theater Security Package deployment—and since the Air Force initially made a deliberate decision to not fund our Reservists for this deployment, we find ourselves in the challenging situation of completing pre-deployment actions while truly not knowing if we will be allowed to participate. While many conclusions can be derived from such a decision, perhaps the most troubling is that such action brings into question the very viability of a Total Force Integration program.

As a unit we have committed deeply to employing extensive TFI principles in our organizational construct and our operational



employment. By design, we are woven into the integrated F-22 organizational fabric--we are not an augmentation force that can be simply sliced from the Team without serious operational impact. It is important to understand that both RegAF and AFRC key leadership comprehends this fact—that the lack of MPA funding in this case clearly does not meet the Commander's Intent for the TFI program.

I commend our unit members for maintaining your dedication and professionalism during these circumstances. Your resolute effort to manage this particular challenge is not only a strong testimonial for the Elmendorf Associate—it is a strong statement for the entire Total Force Enterprise.

W-2s now available

Why wait for the mail? Military service members, military retirees and annuitants, and federal civilian employees paid by the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) can get their 2010 tax statements now using **myPay**.

DFAS customers with *myPay* access (<u>https://mypay.dfas.mil/mypay.aspx</u>) will be able to obtain their tax statements online on the day they are posted using the secure and convenient pay management system.

Tax statements available through **myPay** are approved for use by the IRS. In addition to their earlier availability over mailed forms, tax statements posted to accounts in **myPay** remain available throughout the year.

Using *myPay* to access tax statements eliminates the preparation and mailing costs incurred with the traditional distribution methods. Combined with the earlier availability of statements online, this makes *myPay* a better option for many DFAS customers and the Department of Defense.

DFAS customers who have forgotten their user name, password or wish to open a *myPay* account can do so on the *myPay* Web site at https:// mypay.dfas.mil/mypay.aspx.

The Air Force Legal Assistance website (<u>https://aflegalassistance.law.af.mil</u>) has a lot of great information on legal assistance subjects. It also has an online will worksheet, which streamlines the process of getting a will.

Consider whether you have all the necessary legal documents (will, living will, health care power of attorney, power of attorney etc) ready to go in case of your death or disability. Legal advice and assistance is free so there is no excuse to be unprepared!

Family Care Plans

Who Requires a Family Care Plan?

- -Single parents who have custody of a child under the age of 19
- -Dual military couples with dependents
- -Members with civilian spouses who have unique family situations
- -Assumption of sole care for an elderly or disabled family member
- -Absence of a spouse through career or job commitments or other personal reasons

If you haven't already been identified, see your First Sergeant as soon as possible. They will counsel you on your responsibilities.

Military OneSource tax service information is available to you as a Reservist and your family starting 17 Jan 2011. Visit www.MilitaryOneSource.com to file your federal and state taxes.

Leave taken on non-duty days

When military members take leave the day before and the day after non-duty days, all the days (duty and non-duty) must be charged as leave. For example, if member takes leave Friday and Monday, then leave will be charged Fri, Sat, Sun, and Mon. Submit one leave request for the entire leave period. 
PME Graduates
