INSPECTOR GENERAL

Who may file Air Force IG complaints? Any military or civilian member may file an IG complaint. Anyone can report FWA.

What types of complaints are appropriate? Any instance of FWA or violation of law, AFI, or policy should be reported through the appropriate grievance channel. The subject of your complaint must be an AF program or person.

When are IG complaints appropriate? Individuals should attempt to resolve issues at the lowest levels, using command channels before elevating them to the next higher lever or to the IG.

Further, complaints must be promptly filed within command, IG, or other grievance channels. IG's will likely dismiss complaints if more than 60 days have passed since the occurrence.

Where to file a complaint? IG complaints can be filed with any IG. Preferably, the complaint is filed with an IG in the same command as the subject of the complaint. If not, expect the complaint to get transferred to the subject's command which will slightly delay resolution.

The 477th IG is available during UTA weekends in the HQ building room 103A, 551-1477. The AFRC/IG is available M-F during normal business hours (CST) at DSN 312-497-1510. The 673rd ABW/IG is available M-F during normal business hours at 552-8384. FWA complaints can be made 24 hours a day to the JBER FWA hotline 552-2400.

LEAVE TAKEN IN CONJUNCTION WITH NON-DUTY DAYS: When military members take leave the day before and the day after non-duty days, all the days (duty and non-duty) must be charged as leave. For example, if member takes leave Friday and Monday, then leave will be charged Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and Monday. Submit one leave request for the entire leave period.

TRAVEL VOUCHERS BACKLOG: Hardcopy travel vouchers are taking about four weeks to pay at the Air Force Financial Services Center at Ellsworth AFB. To minimize delays ensure: 1) Travel vouchers are completed properly; comply with the TDY voucher checklist and include all required attachments.

2) Submit vouchers within five workdays of completion of TDYs.

GOVERNMENT TRAVEL CARD (GTC) MIS-SION CRITICAL STATUS: Are you at risk of becoming delinquent on your GTC? If you've submitted a travel voucher on time with the appropriate split disbursement amount to the GTC bank, and through no fault of yours the bank will not be paid for your official travel expenses, then see your unit agency program coordinator to code your bank record as "mission critical" status. This status will keep your GTC account from going delinquent to allow time for resolution of the travel voucher payment to the bank. Reminder, ensure the GTC bank has your correct mailing address.
