AROWS ORDERS AND TRAVEL VOUCHER NOTIFICATIONS: Want to be contacted when your orders are ready and when your travel vouchers have been paid? AROWS-R provides capability for you to input email addresses, more than one if you prefer. Any email accounts will do: work, home, or other. Multiple email addresses ensure you will receive notice of published orders and paid travel vouchers. To update or add email addresses, sign into AROWS-R, click "My Account", and add or change the addresses in "Email Address" and "Travel Voucher Distribution List". Note that if you add multiple addresses, you must separate them with a semicolon (;).

MIXING ACTIVE AND INACTIVE DUTY: Active duty tours (ADSW, ADT, AT, School, MPA, etc.) and inactive duty tours (UTA, AFTP, and RMP) cannot be performed on the same day. On a given day you can be paid for active duty or inactive duty, but not both. If your active duty tour is away from Elmendorf, you will receive military pay for the travel days. For pay purposes those travel days are considered active duty days, therefore you cannot be paid for inactive duty on the travel days. And if you perform a Readiness Management Period (RMP), you cannot be paid for any other duty types that day.

LEAVE START DATE ADJUSTMENTS: If a military leave form has been given a leave authorization number, and the member will depart before or after the first day of leave indicated on the form, cancel the original leave request by completing appropriate blocks on Part III and submitting it to the RPO. Prepare a new leave request with corrected first day and get a new leave number. Process Part III of the new leave authorization as normal.

Yellow Ribbon for returning deployers

Members of the 477 FG attended their first Western regional Yellow Ribbon event in Tempe, AZ, May 13-15. Attendees included two 477 MXS personnel and one 477 AMXS attending their 30-Day Post Deployment event and one AMDF member attending her Pre-Deployment event. In addition, one leadership representative from Maintenance helped staff the event as well as three FSS members who helped with registration and childcare. The Yellow Ribbon staff welcomed 141 attendees to the Tempe Mission Palms Hotel in the heart of Tempe.

The event consisted of an information fair with 22 organizations, a keynote speaker, briefings and multiple breakout sessions covering subjects ranging from Marriage Enrichment and Single Member Deployments to Parenting and Financial Counseling classes.

Eligible participants are those that have recently returned from a 90-day deployment and those who are within 90 days of leaving for a deployment in which they will be separated from their families for 90 days or more. All travel expenses, hotel and meals will be provided at no cost to eligible participants and their approved family members.
